## Indicate the current status of the plan (where the plan stands on the date of the activity report, no more than ten lines):

The program throughout the year was severely impacted by the ongoing war, which reduced the availability of our Bar Mitzvah mentors by over 60%. Although we took steps to "stretch" the remaining mentors' availability to meet demand, including providing them with leased cars to make it possible for them to reach families in distant locations and concentrating the

program into 6 rather than 8 sessions, the number served during the year was far lower than previous years. We hope to be able to increase the numbers in the year ahead.

### Achievements of the past year (goals attained, number of events, number of participants, etc.):

- Despite the challenges created by the war, 31 boys from Russian-speaking families used our services to help them prepare for and carry out their Bar Mitzvah ceremonies.
- We received highly positive feedback regarding all of the events. Please refer to Appendix C below)
- As part of our efforts to increase awareness of the project, we carried out a pilot engagement of a dedicated outreach coordinator. We have decided not to continue with this investment, and will continue investigating other channels for promoting the program.

#### **Assessment:**

- We continue to receive extremely positive feedback from participating families both about the quality of our mentors and the contents of the course itself. For examples, please refer to the Appendix C below.
- Our primary challenge, given the ongoing war, is increasing the number of the program's mentors in order to increase the number of Russian-speaking families we can serve.

#### Guidelines for the advancement of the program in 2024-25:

We are currently forming the program's strategic plan for the coming year, and expect to complete it in November 2025. Based on our budget, we are considering the following elements:

Recruiting more mentors, and providing them with training regarding the needs of the
Russian-speaking community. The goal of the training is to sensitize them to the special
characteristics of families who have immigrated to Israel from the FSR, and providing
them with tools for meeting their needs regarding the bar mitzvah process.

 Continuing to expand our outreach to local authorities and organizations active with the Russian-speaking community. This will help us further increase awareness of our program.
