I'm pleased to share that, with the Feuerstein Institute's help, I have achieved an excellent academic record (89 GPA) and started an internship at Israel's top law firm. I've served as a TA in two different courses, am a member of the Israel Law Review, and have been (and still am) a research assistant on one academic paper, with a book scheduled to be published next year.

I was first exposed to the Feuerstein program in 2020, towards the end of my academic year at the Academic Preparatory Program for Exact Sciences. After being selected and accepted to the program, I enrolled in a degree in computer science at Bar-Ilan University. Unfortunately, I didn't complete the first semester of this degree, and the university stopped my studies.

After a year, I underwent career counseling, during which I was recommended to study computer science. I had attempted to do so before the preparatory program, right after my year of army service, by studying Computer Science, Mathematics, or Accounting at Ariel University.

I contacted Racheli, one of the coordinators of the Aim Higher program, who has been a constant source of support and guidance. She has accompanied me both during the first year of computer science and afterwards, until the beginning of my studies in economics, accounting, and, of course, to this day. Racheli, together with facilitator Leah, helped me cope with the feeling of failure that had gripped me at that time and encouraged me to get up and continue learning, rather than giving up. Based on the grades I achieved in the preparatory program, I was accepted into a degree program in Economics and Accounting at the university, without any connection to the psychometric test (i.e., without the help of Feuerstein). However, the program welcomed me back with a warm embrace.

The program helps me and all the other students to arrange our schedules properly.
